ABC Presenter and experienced company director Dan Bourchier joins Dart Centre for Journalism and Trauma Asia-Pacific

The Dart Centre Asia Pacific is thrilled to announce that ABC Presenter Dan Bourchier has joined the board.

DCAP focusses on journalism and trauma in the media industry, promoting trauma-informed best practice for media practitioners and the subjects of their stories.

Mr Bourchier is the ABC's nightly news presenter in Canberra and appears regularly on ABC radio and TV across the country. An award-winning multi-platform broadcaster, he has 20 years' experience as a reporter working in Australia and around the world.

He is an accomplished board director, serving as a non-executive director at the University of Canberra and BlakDance.

"Dan brings so much to the DCAP board," DCAP Chair Karen Percy said.

"His life experience, his understanding of the media and his decency and humanity are a unique combination."

Ms Percy noted DCAP is at an important stage, after founding Managing Director Cait McMahon OAM, retired last year after 18 years.

"Dan has got great skills and experience in governance," she said.

"These attributes will greatly assist the board and our organisation as we navigate the increasingly complex needs of the media industry across the region."

Mr Bourchier's work as a company director to date has been underpinned by cultural and ethical governance, strategy development and delivery, and strategic and crisis communications.

He is Deputy Chair of the ABC's Bonner Committee, the national broadcaster's Indigenous Advisory Committee, among others.

"I'm really thrilled to be joining the board of the Dart Centre Asia Pacific - and being part of the team to lead the next phase of the organisation's important work of helping to build and strengthen resilience in those reporting on trauma," Mr Bourchier said.

"I've been a journalist for more than 20 years and have reported and covered very challenging and difficult situations - I see open discussions about trauma and resilience as crucial.

"I'm pleased to bring my governance and leadership skills, grounded in cultural governance, with a focus on strategy and strategic planning, risk management and communications - and I'm looking forward to joining the board under the strong leadership of respected journalist, Chair Karen Percy.

"There is much work to do, and I'm honoured to be joining the team."

Mr Bourchier is respected for bringing deep and unflinching knowledge of First Nations cultural governance and leadership.

"Dan is driven by sharing important stories in a trauma-informed way, which makes him an invaluable new member of the Dart Centre Asia Pacific team," DCAP CEO Erin Smith said.

DCAP was founded by Cait McMahon OAM in 2003 and is a hub of the Dart Centre US, based at Columbia University in New York, USA. Dr McMahon retired last year but remains a board director. The other directors are Rachael Hocking, Tony Gillies and Kamal Farouque.

Dan Bourchier grew up in the remote Northern Territory town of Tennant Creek, where he was mentored by elders from around the region, while coming to understand his own First Nations heritage from his mum's side of the family in Victoria. He was driven to news and reporting from an early age, and began a traineeship at the Tennant and District Times as a teenager, still at school. Dan has worked as a radio broadcaster, newspaper reporter, video journalist, foreign correspondent, political reporter, and social commentator. It was his upbringing which instilled a passion for storytelling, while also instilling a strong sense of social justice and leadership - and his extensive experience which have honed and focused those skills.
